LPC met on Tuesday 18th Feb. There were two planning applications discussed. PA25/00490, works to trees in Polyphant, which was supported and PA25/0049 extension to Hill Park Cottage which was also supported. Our Unitary Councillor sent his report to the Council which is also on his face book page. He reported that Launceston Adult Education Centre is to remain open, our Councillors lobbied hard to put together a strong case to ensure that this vital service remains open. Adrian's full report is available on his official facebook page.

The Telephone boxes, which are owned by the Parish Council are listed structures, and are in need of a spring clean along with the bus shelters, the Clerk is going to approach a local handy man to get this done with a view of undertaking cleaning these every six months. It has also been reported that the Oak tree opposite the shop at Polyphant Green has been ring marked. This is a very upsetting act of vandalism which will probably lead to the tree having to be felled. If anyone has any information about this, could they please contact the Clerk or a Parish Councillor.

Lewannick Play area has had the internal fencing removed to allow space for the new slide and ultimately the spinning hat which will be installed at a later date. In Polyphant the wild flowers are coming through which will add a lot of colour. Parish Matters, two large potholes in Trevadlock have been reported to the Clerk, these will again be reported to the Council. A letter has been received about the bin at Two Bridges overflowing, this is not a Parish Council Bin, so the Clerk has referred this to Cornwall Council and Highways. The next meeting will be 18th March @ 7.30 in Lewannick Village Hall.
